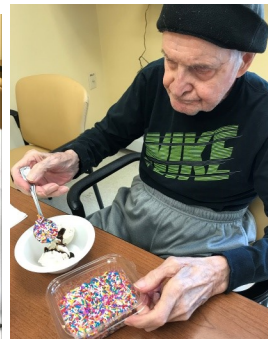
### LUCKY STRIKE!
